Course Prerequisites: Themes in Literature

Topics Included in Course:

- Understand epic literature focusing on the hero's journey and themes of good and evil, providence/fate, pride/humility, individual freedom/choice, heroism/courage, forgiveness/redemption and friendship/fellowship.
- Apply the above themes to our individual lives as Christian through journal entries.
- Explore an author's use of world-building including setting, characterization, myth and language.
- Build skills including annotating passages, journaling ideas, note-taking, outlining and literary analysis.

Students can expect to spend an average of 1 hour a day on homework

Supplies:

- 3-ring binder with Dividers for handouts and notetaking
- Pens (blue or black AND red ink)
- Post-It notes for annotating books (if you don't want to or can't write in the novels)
- Access to a dictionary and thesaurus and to a library and computer for extensive research
- A computer, laptop, or tablet with internet access and ability to access **Microsoft Teams** through Pioneers.
